

Chief Troy Hagen
Regina Police Service
Lifetime Achievement Award

Chief Hagen joined the Regina Police Service in 1979. Through the course of his career he worked in Community Services, Criminal Investigations, and Administrative Divisions in a variety of postings that included Patrol, Drug Unit, Property Crimes, Stolen Auto, and Crime Prevention. He was also a member of the Regina Police Service Special Weapons Team and Tactical Team.

He was appointed Chief of Police on May 13, 2008, following promotions to Staff Sergeant, Inspector in charge of North District, Superintendent of Community Services Division, and Deputy Chief.

Chief Hagen served as an elected member of the Regina Police Association for 16 years – 9 years as President, as Trustee on the Administrative Board of Trustees for the Regina Police Service Pension Plan, and Vice-President and President of the Regina Police Senior Officers Association.

Chief Hagen was a strong proponent of the Community and Cultural Diversity Unit through the Regina Police Round Dance, Treaty Four Citizens Police Academy and the Elders Advisory Council.

Under Chief Hagen's direction, the Regina Police Service was recognized as one of Canada's Top Employers in the Saskatchewan category from 2010 – 2012.

In August of 2011, Chief Hagen led a contingent to speak to the Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force in St. Kitts.

In October of 2011, he and his contingent were invited to the Caribbean Community Secretariat Conference in Guyana to speak on Gang Issues and Community Policing.
