

**Cst. Curtis Bradbury**

Cst. Bradbury began his policing career with the RCMP, then joined the Prince Albert Police Service in May of 2010.

Cst. Bradbury has served in the Patrol Division and the Criminal Investigation Division. He has just completed a term in the Integrated Intelligence Unit and has returned to the Patrol Division.

Cst. Bradbury is highly regarded and well respected as a Police Officer and Investigator. He was seconded to the RCMP Major Crimes Unit on two separate homicide investigations in 2016.

On November 24, 2016, Cst. Bradbury voluntarily became involved in a missing person investigation outside his expected area of responsibility. He became aware of a missing 19 year old female, who was allegedly abducted by unknown individuals.

The abduction was not reported until several hours after it occurred. Cst. Bradbury recognized the seriousness of the incident and without supervision or expectation became deeply involved in the investigation.

Cst. Bradbury worked closely with the RCMP, Saskatoon Police Service, Facebook, and Sasktel to identify the location of the missing person. Upon learning the suspected location, Saskatoon Police Service were able to gain entry to a residence using a combination of Cst. Bradbury's information and exigent circumstances. The missing female was safely located and appropriate charges were processed against those responsible.

Her safe return can be attributed directly to the exemplary efforts of Cst. Bradbury and his coordinated effort with multiple agencies.
