Sgt. Weber began her career with Saskatoon Police Service in August of 2004, working in the Patrol Division and the Cultural/School Resource Units. When she was promoted to the Rank of Sergeant she worked in the Domestic Violence Unit and most recently became the Sergeant i/c of the School Resource Unit.

Sgt. Weber is a natural leader and a respected representative of the Saskatoon Police Service. She is often approached for guidance and mentorship by other members of the Saskatoon Police Service, those in the education community, and post-secondary institutions.

Sgt. Weber is noted for her willingness to take risks and step outside her comfort zone to enhance and strengthen Community Partnerships. An example of this is - she became a community-based train the trainer, in Violence Threat Risk Assessment. Her success in this area was validated when she was asked to provide training outside the Saskatoon Community. She was also specifically requested to assist in the healing process following the La Loche School Shooting.

Sgt. Weber has been an advocate and leader of the Community Threat Assessment and Support Protocol. This is a partnership of 19 agencies that provides over 70,000 students with safer schools and communities. It provides for early intervention, violence prevention and high-risk assessments. As a Violence Threat Risk Assessment Trainer, she has helped train over 300 community members.

In Partnership with both the Public and Catholic School Boards, Sgt. Weber recently developed the "Cadet Orientation Police Studies Program", slated to begin in early 2017.

Sgt. Weber is passionate about her community and a proud member of the Saskatoon Police Service who ensures that all of her responsibilities are completed to the highest standard. She exemplifies the "Golden Rule" and treats everyone with the utmost respect, compassion, and empathy.
